The Prof. Joachim Lenz Foundation supports graduates of technical degree programmes from Central Europe, Eastern Europe and Russia with a one-year internship at a German company.

Furthermore, the Prof. Joachim Lenz Foundation looks to promote bilateral projects and engineering work, and therefore awards a foundation prize amounting to € 10,000 every three years. A jury decides who the prize will be awarded to. Special terms and conditions may be associated with the allocation and use of the foundation prize.

Future-orientated topics, questions and approaches, as well as the desire to consolidate and strengthen relations between Germany and its neighbours in Eastern Europe, are considered to be of particular interest in the call for tenders and presentation of the foundation prize.

Application requirements:

The project or engineering work must:

- be related to essential resources such as energy and/or water or wastewater.
- involve cooperation between Germany and at least one neighbouring country.
- have a clear practical application, or have already been proven to be practical, or involve an outstanding theoretical approach.

The jury is made up of figures from the spheres of politics, business and/or academia.

External evaluators may be consulted.

Application documents:

- Candidate profiles of the participants.
- Participants' CVs with passport photos.
- A short description of the project or engineering work.
- Appendices on the progression of the project or engineering work.
- Result reports and evaluations.
- Names and contact details of all those involved.
